We have some wonderful opportunities to assist others and every lady is encouraged to join us on the first Wed. night of each month to discuss the needs of our community and how we can lend ourselves in His service.

Admittedly at times we seem overwhelmed at the declining economy and so many people having to make severe sacrifices that we could easily find a way to cease being "on mission", but with God's guidance and prayerful consideration, we remain committed to show others that **UNION CROSS REACHES OUT TO SHOW HIS LOVE**.
